

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## Prospectus

### Academic Session 2025-26

The institution was established on 1<sup>st</sup> of September, 1970 to cater to the educational and cultural needs for the people of a locality stretching to the rural neighbourhood in the western fringe of the town of Chandannagar. The establishment was possible because of the initiative taken by some pious and philanthropic persons. In the initial years of the journey the college achieved the recognition of the UGC under 2F and 12B, and got the affiliation under the University of Burdwan. The early years witnessed the excellence of the College in National Service Scheme and the establishment of Hooghly District Blood Donors Society. From the last two decades of the last century Khalisani Mahavidyalaya have expanded their horizon and introduced various subjects in both Major and Minor (4-year & 3-year) programmes and also running the CBCS curriculum in B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. streams. The College is now providing courses to almost 1000 students who are coming from a large feeder zone comprising of the urban settlements like Chandannagar, Chinsurah, Bandel and the rural areas of Singur. Majority of the students passed from the institutions are at present well established citizens in various facets of professions. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council re-accredited the College with Grade B in the year 2024. The college participated in '**RUSA (RASHTRIYA UCHCHATAR SHIKSHA ABHIYAN) 2.0' Challenge Level Funding** in 2017 and achieved the funding in 2018.

## **RULES AND DISCIPLINES:**

The students of the College have to abide by the following rules and regulations formulated by the institution. Students may have to face disciplinary actions if they fail to abide by the disciplinary obligations.

- 1) The students must bring their college identity card and show it while entering the College on regular basis.
- 2) The students have to be regular in classes in each semester otherwise, he or she will be treated as non-collegiate.
- 3) The students should bring their guardian whenever asked for. Guardian will be called for the students who failed in the Test examinations or who breached college code of conduct.

Calcutta: Mathematics is  
not just for textbooks, it can  
effectively address real-world  
issues — even those faced  
by supply chains in bustling  
cities.

## Campus placements boost hopes

Calcutta Sunishi Kumar Roy,  
daughter of a jute mill worker from  
Hooghly's Bhadrabad, could not  
imagine that she would get a job at an  
IT major within a few months after  
graduation.

Presently holder another com-  
merce graduate from Khalisani  
Mahavidyalaya in Hooghly's  
Chandernagore, who had opted to  
work as a delivery boy for a courier  
agency to run his family, is now at  
Tata Consultancy Services (TCS).  
Landed has revealed him during last  
week's campus placement drive.

It is a time for celebration at the  
homes of at least 32 students like  
Titas Das, Tanay Ghosh, Pallab Roy,  
Sunishi and Prasenjit, most of whom  
are from very humble backgrounds,  
after the first ever campus placement  
camp was held on an initiative set com-  
mon at such institutions in Bengal.

"We received a proposal from the  
state government's skill development  
department — Diksha (Skill) — ask-  
ing whether we would to organise such a  
camp. We did not delay in accepting the  
proposal as it would be a great boost to  
our institution where most students  
are first generation college students,"  
said Arghya Bandopadhyay, principal  
of Khalisani Mahavidyalaya, a century  
graduate college established in 1906.

A teacher said the success of the  
placement drive and recruitment in a  
top-notch company like the TCS would  
help attract more students from the  
area and reverse the rural trend of a  
skilled labour migration for general  
degree courses.

We launched 2,500-4,000 stu-  
dents till five years ago and now the  
count is 2,500. The picture is true for  
most general degree colleges as job op-  
portunities for graduates students have  
taken a hit following the recruitment  
drive in IT sector. If we can organise such  
camps, then students would show in-  
terest in studying in institutions like  
ours," said a senior faculty member of  
the college.

She said another corporate biggest  
Reliance is likely to hold a placement  
camp in the college on March 22.

To underline the importance of  
holding such a placement camp in a  
rural college, a senior teacher said,  
"Imagine the impact of a job with a  
leading company like TCS on students  
whose families are struggling to sup-  
port their child's education. It is not a  
question of how much they would earn  
at the beginning but we are happy to  
have helped our students take an im-  
portant step towards building a better  
future for themselves and their fam-  
ilies. We can visualise the happiness in  
Pallab's family whose father drives a  
car for the living, the family of Titas,  
whose father's sole source of income is  
a small grocery shop. And as 10 of the  
recruited are girls, don't forget it's all  
about empowering women."
